## Happiness/Light

- Love—affection, devotion, a deep and enduring emotional regard
- **Rejoicing (praise)**—feeling or expression of joy; expressing admiration, worship
- Thankfulness—feeling or expressing gratitude; appreciative
- Joy—emotion of happiness caused by something exceptionally good
- Faith—belief in something not based on proof; belief in God or a religion
- Forgiveness—the act of forgiving, or letting go of anger or hard feelings
- Patience (long suffering)—able to bear any affliction without complaint
- Humility (meekness)—being humble, or not proud or arrogant; modest
- Harmony—agreement; accord; harmonious relations; tranquility
- Unity—oneness of mind, feeling, among a number of persons; agreement
- **Peace**—a state of mutual harmony between people or groups; order; security
- Temperance—moderation or self-restraint in action; self-control
- Goodness—moral excellence; virtue; kindly feeling; generous
- **Gentleness**—being docile; delicate; moderate; amiable; chivalrous
- Kindness—being sympathetic or helpful; affectionate; loving
- **Charity**—generosity and helpfulness, especially toward the needy or suffering; loving
- **Optimism**—to look for the best in people or things; anticipate the best outcome
- Self-Confidence-to believe in one's powers and abilities

## Misery/Darkness

- Hate—extreme dislike or disgust; intense hostility and aversion
- Faultfinding (criticizing)—to find fault with; point out the faults of
- Envy—a feeling of discontent or covetousness towards another's success, possessions
- Depression—feeling sad and gloomy, dejected; downcast
- **Disbelief (doubt)**—inability or refusal to believe or to accept something as true
- Vengeance—infliction of injury, harm, etc. on a person in retaliation for an offense
- **Discouragement**—a state of disheartenment; lacking courage or confidence
- Pride—a high or inordinate opinion of one's own dignity, importance, or superiority
- **Discord (quarrel)**—a lack of harmony between persons; disagreement; dispute
- **Division**—being divided, separated; separation by difference of opinion or feeling
- Contention (argument)—struggling together in opposition; strife; dispute
- Self-indulgence—indulging one's own desires, passions, especially without restraint
- Evildoing—acting morally wrong or bad; immoral; wicked; harmful
- Anger—a strong feeling of displeasure and usually of antagonism
- **Backbiting**—to say mean or spiteful things about a person (often not present)
- Selfishness—being excessively or exclusively concerned with oneself, not others
- Fear (worry, anxiety)—to expect the worst; feel apprehensive or uneasy or anxious
- Self-doubt—lack of confidence in the reliability of one's own motives, or in oneself
